KEEP YOUR TEEN SAFE DURING PROM AND GRADUATION

The "season" is almost here...prom and graduation are two milestones in a teen's life. Teens and parents are beginning to get excited about the planning and celebrating. As these events tend to bring an increased pressure to "break the rules" like using alcohol, parents need to be involved and should ask "What can I do to make sure my teen stays safe and makes smart decisions?"

When it comes to underage drinking, studies have shown that parents have more power over the decisions their teens make than they may realize. Parents can empower their teens to make intelligent decisions by talking openly and honestly with them about underage use of alcohol and by setting clear and consistent rules/guidelines. When parents establish clear "no alcohol" rules and expectations, their teens are less likely to begin drinking.

Parents are the most important role models for their children. Parents need to know that it is OK to host a party in their home and not provide alcohol or to not allow alcohol to be served or consumed. Parents need to be the positive role models, standing firm in the decision not to provide alcohol to minors at parties nor to allow alcohol at parties. Parents should have the final say when planning a teen party and it is OK to have an "alcohol free" party.

As the parent of a teen, enjoy this time with your child, be involved in the planning process of the prom and graduation activities and put your positive parent powers to work to help make this time a truly happy and memorable one.
