Welcome



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Who?

“College Ready” students in
grades 7 through 12 who
qualify for admission



What?

- College courses taken for both high school and college credit.
- Can be taken:
 - On a college campus
 - Online through an affiliated college
 - At your high school (not available for 2022-2023 school year)



When?

- Whenever college courses are offered during the school year and during summer sessions.
 - Day
 - Night
 - Weekend



Where?

- CCP option @ IHE
 - IHE = Institute of Higher Education
- Examples:
 - University of Cincinnati
 - Sinclair
 - Art Academy of Cincinnati
 - Cincinnati State
 - Chatfield
 - Miami (Hamilton)



Why?

- To challenge yourself in college coursework and/or in order to take courses that are not available at your high school.
- To earn college credit while still in school.
- No cost to student/family
 - *contingent on successful completion of the course



How?

- Express Interest (by March 31, 2022)
- Apply (by IHE deadlines)
- Test if necessary (follow IHE deadlines)
- Enroll in course(s)(follow IHE deadlines)



Express Interest

Turn in Paperwork

- Turn in:
 1. Intent to Enroll
 2. Acknowledgement of Application Information (front and back)
- Does not obligate you to participate, but gives you the option
- State deadline for Intent to Enroll – March 31st



What courses are available?

- Level 1 Courses- “First 15”
 - Transferable courses
 - Courses in computer science, IT, A&P, or World Language
 - Course in a designated certificate program
 - 15 credit hour or 30 credit hour model pathway courses
 - Study skills, academic or career success skills courses
 - Internship courses
- Level 2 Courses
 - Courses available after Level 1 is complete
 - Any other college courses for which the student meets the prerequisites

Steps to Apply

- Identify course you are interested and eligible to take
- Obtain, complete and submit the application for IHE by **IHE deadline**
- Request transcript through counseling office
- Test scores (ACT/SAT)- and/or placement test
- Set up and check IHE e-mail account when told to!!!

Deciding to Participate

1. IHE's have their own withdraw dates
2. CCP is for transcribed credit
3. FHSD does not guarantee courses transfer
 - Credit transfer to public Ohio IHE's is required
 - Private or out-of-state should be verified
4. Athletic eligibility & scheduling for extracurricular activities
5. Transportation and parking costs are student's responsibility



Communication is Key

Talk with your counselor!

- When applying
- When notified of acceptance status
- When registering for classes
- **TIMING IS KEY**- know your deadlines
- If you change classes (drop, add, substitute)
 - Impact on graduation
 - Impact on payment
 - Athletic eligibility
- Grades
 - Failing a CCP course



Potential Risks

- Be aware of all procedures & classroom expectations that could be very different from your high school
- College grading scales can be different from ours. The grade reported from the college will be what appears on your transcript. This may impact Honor Roll.
- Calendar years can be different, all final grades must be reported to your high school before graduation in order to participate in the ceremony. Also, vacations may not line up and if you are taking courses through both schools, you may not get one.
- Transferability does not equal applicability



Parent Update

- New to College Credit Plus courses, starting in 2022-2023, is a disclaimer as part of the sign-up process.
- ODE Wording: Parents Please Note:
"The subject matter of a course enrolled in under the college credit plus program may include mature subject matter or materials, including those of a graphic, explicit, violent, or sexual nature, that will not be modified based upon college credit plus enrollee participation regardless of where course instruction occurs."



Non-Allowable Courses

These courses are not permitted under College Credit Plus

- Applied courses with one-on-one private instruction
- Courses with high fees (\$750 or more)
- Study abroad courses
- Physical education courses
- P/F or S/U courses (unless the course in an internship or is a transferable course with the same grading scale for all students enrolled.)
- Remedial courses
- Sectarian religion courses



Credit Limits

- Limits
30 semester credit hours per school year (includes summer school)
- Not more than 120 semester hour credits in middle & high combined





Credit Equivalence

Three or more CCP
semester hour credits
=
1 High School
Credit



Total Credit Limits by Year

- Determine # of high school credits taking (Carnegie Units)
- Multiply that number by 3
- Subtract result from 30
- =maximum # of CCP semester credit hours in a single school year





Example

Example:

4 HS Credits (Carnegie Units)

$$\times 3 = 12$$

Result:

No more than 18 CCP semester
hours (college credits) allowed



Added Weight Given to CCP Courses

- CCP courses are weighted according to the highest weight offered in the corresponding FHSD content department as required by the State of Ohio.



Probation/Dismissal/Appeal info

- [CCP Probation:](#) An underperforming student is placed on CCP probation
 - May take no more than 1 CCP course the next semester
- An underperforming student is defined as a student who:
 - Has a cumulative GPA of lower than 2.0 in the college courses taken through the CCP Program; or
 - Withdraws from, or receives no credit for, two or more courses in the same term.
- [CCP Dismissal](#)
 - An ineligible student must be dismissed from the program
- An ineligible student is defined as a student who meets the definition of an underperforming student for two consecutive terms of enrollment
