ELEMENTARY SUMMER SCHOOL (K-6)

DATES: June 10-July 12 (*no school July 4 and 5*)

FREQUENCY: 5 days a week

LOCATION: Sherwood Elementary, 7080 Grantham Way

COST: \$160 per course

Courses:

Kindergarten Skills (Reading, Writing, Math)

This course is designed for students who completed kindergarten in 2018-19. The class will provide additional practice in reading, writing and math and will focus on language development through daily activities with books, writing and drawing. This class will be offered at two times (students attend one time frame) TIMES: 9 a.m.-10:30 a.m. or 10:30 a.m.-12 p.m.

Reading/Writing Intervention

This course is designed to support students working below grade level during the academic year. Students will strengthen and reinforce their reading and writing skills by engaging in a variety of literacy activities to develop reading, vocabulary, comprehension and writing. TIME: 9 a.m.-10:30 a.m.

Math Intervention

This course is designed to support students working below grade level during the academic year. Students will strengthen and reinforce their math skills by engaging in a variety of math activities and games to develop concept building, problem-solving and overall math skills. TIME: 10:30 a.m.-12 p.m.

Reading/Writing Enrichment

This course is designed to support students working at or above grade level during the academic year. Students will strengthen their reading and writing skills by engaging in a variety of literacy activities to develop higher level thinking in reading, vocabulary, comprehension and writing. TIME: 9 a.m.-10:30 a.m.

Math Enrichment

This course is designed to support students working at or above grade level during the academic year. Students will strengthen their math skills through higher level thinking with concept building activities,

problem-solving and motivating math games. TIME: 10:30 a.m.-12 p.m.
