

Did you hear?

Forest Hills School District needs operating funds.



A 4.7 mill operating levy will be on the November 2019 ballot.

- It has been **seven years** since the district last requested an operating levy.
- **73 cents from every dollar** is spent on students at Forest Hills. That means the district spends \$4.5 million more on classroom instruction than if it operated at the state average, according to the Ohio Department of Education.
- **Forest Hills is a high-performing school district** and both high schools are among the top 4% statewide, according to U.S News & World Report.
- With the passage of an additional 4.7 mills, **Forest Hills will maintain a millage rate less than the average** rate in Hamilton County.
