## **FHSD Remote Learning Tuesday, January 18th**

**Good Evening Forest Hills Parents and Families,**

**Seasonal sickness, COVID-related absences and 2022 revised CDC guidelines have created building and department educational and operational stresses throughout the district. Therefore, I'm writing to inform you of my decision to declare Tuesday, January 18 as a district-wide remote learning day.**

**Adding a remote day on Tuesday, January 18 to the district's previously scheduled four day break, inclusive of this Friday's non-instruction day, and the observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day on Monday, will create a window of five consecutive days. Based on CDC and Hamilton County Public Health, five-day quarantine/isolation guidelines, I believe this decision will provide students and staff currently out due to COVID-related and other health illnesses the time needed to recover and return to school and work.**

**Provided below are general instructions for students and parents regarding remote day expectations. As in all situations, should you have specific questions please contact your child's teacher.**

### **Elementary Remote Learning Expectations**

**For Tuesday's PreK-6 remote learning day, students will be expected to complete all assigned and posted work for each class. This week teachers will inform students of their assignment responsibilities. Students currently home due to illness or quarantine will receive electronic communication from their teacher via email or schoology.**

### **Secondary Remote Learning Expectations**

**For Tuesday's 7-12 remote learning day, teachers will post assignments to Schoology for all of their classes on or before Friday at 4:00 p.m.**

**According to health experts, Omicron is three to four times more contagious than former COVID strains. The opportunity to achieve a five day window of whole district separation during the remainder of the 2022 school year through the implementation of a single remote learning day is not possible. Therefore, I respectfully request that all students and staff refrain from attendance at unnecessary gatherings and nonessential trips outside of the home. "OUR" success is**
