

Secondary Summer School 2019

Summer school course options are listed below. MIDDLE SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL (Grades 7-8)

DATES: June 10-July 19 (*no school July 4 and July 5*)

FREQUENCY: 5 days a week

LOCATION: Nagel Middle School, 1500 Nagel Road

COST: \$180 per course for residents, \$230 per course for non-residents

COURSES:

Grade 7 Language Arts Skills

This class is a remedial program designed to provide individualized instruction in language arts to students in grade 7. TIME: 8:30 a.m.-10 a.m.

Grade 7 Math Skills

This class is a remedial program designed to provide individualized instruction in math to students in grade 7. TIME: 10 a.m.-11:30 a.m.

Grade 8 Language Arts Skills

This class is a remedial program designed to provide individualized instruction in language arts to students in grade 8. TIME: 10 a.m.-11:30 a.m.

Grade 8 Math Skills

This class is a remedial program designed to provide individualized instruction in math to students in grade 8. TIME: 8:30 a.m.-10 a.m.

Summer Bridge Course in Mathematics (8th graders going into 9th)

Students will follow a personalized study plan targeted to strengthen math skills and help prepare them for grade 9 math. This course is designed to support students working at or above grade level during the academic year. This course is open to students who were in the eighth grade during the 2018-19 school year. TIME: 8:30 a.m.-10 a.m.

HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL (Grades 9-12)

SESSION ONE DATES: June 10-June 28, 8 a.m.-12 p.m.

SESSION TWO DATES: July 1-July 19 (*no school July 4 and July 5*), 8 a.m.-12:40 p.m.

FREQUENCY: 5 days a week

LOCATION: Nagel Middle School, 1500 Nagel Road

COST: \$180 per course for residents, \$230 per course for non-residents

ORIGINAL CREDIT COURSES (all classes offered both sessions):

Physical Education

Students will participate in a variety of individual, team and lifelong sports, as well as learn physical fitness activities. Students will engage in physical activities that promote skill enhancement, goal setting and lifelong enjoyment. Students will learn to work with others in authentic physical activity to achieve a common goal and learn cooperation and sportsmanship concepts. Some examples of physical fitness activities are tennis, flag football, volleyball, badminton and pickleball. NOTE: This course meets half of the Physical Education requirement. Students may not repeat this course in the second session to meet the PE elective requirement.

Health

The content of this class includes a study of family life, drugs, alcohol, tobacco, diseases, mental health, sexuality and STD's, safety, nutrition and CPR.

Personal Finance

This course is designed to help students in grades 9-12 discover new ways to maximize their earning potential, develop strategies for managing resources, explore skills for the wise use of credit, and gain insight into the different ways of investing money. This course fulfills the financial literacy graduation requirement.

World Cultures

This course will examine cultures of the world from the ancient world to the modern day. Specific geographical targets include North and South America, Europe, Africa, the Middle East and Asia. Students will use 21st Century skills to draw comparisons and connections from ancient civilizations to the modern era. Students will explore the influences of religion, economics, conflict, and political structures.

OHIO'S STATE TEST PREP SESSION DATES: July 8-July 12

COST: \$85 (unless invited by a school administrator)

COST: \$85 (FHSD residents only)

Ohio's State End-of-Course Exam Prep

This course is designed for students who need to earn a 3 or higher on an Ohio State End-of-Course exam to meet Ohio's graduation requirements. Students who take this course will take the needed EOC exam July 15-July 19. Students may take multiple EOC's but not on the same day.

ACT Test Prep

This course is open only to residents of Forest Hills School District and is designed to help students build an awareness of the types of questions on the ACT, teach students test-taking strategies, and allow students the opportunity to practice questions found on the ACT. Enrollment is limited.

SAT Test Prep

This course is open only to residents of Forest Hills School District and is designed to help students build an awareness of the types of questions on the SAT, teach students test-taking strategies, and allow students the opportunity to practice questions found on the SAT. Enrollment is limited. *This course will be subject to cancellation with a full refund based on low enrollment for the course.*
