

FROM THE DISTRICT:

• FHSD is Hiring Substitute Teachers:

In response to the national substitute teacher shortage, FHSD is taking proactive measures to ensure our classrooms are covered by qualified individuals who are compensated at a competitive rate. In November, our Board of Education approved an increase in the pay scale for substitutes in the district (Daily Sub - \$105/day; Building Sub - \$125/day; Long-Term Sub - \$130/day). In addition, the Board is taking advantage of a provision included in Senate Bill 1, passed recently by Governor DeWine, that temporarily makes it possible for individuals with a high school diploma to apply to work as a substitute.

We are currently seeking interested and qualified candidates to work in Forest Hills as a substitute. If you (or someone you know) are interested, please follow the instructions below to begin the process to become a substitute teacher in the Forest Hills School District:

- 1. Go to <u>www.subsolutions.org</u>
- 2. Click the New Sub tab
- 3. Click the Teacher option
- 4. Click the red apply button to complete the application to get the process started
- 5. Sub Solutions will be in contact with you in the Recruit and Hire system to schedule orientation and a background check. Be sure to log in to check the status and read any communication necessary.

Stress is the body's reaction due to pressure from an event, situation, or thoughts. Common stressors for students can include but are not limited to challenges with relationships, academics, family discord, or significant life changes. Students may struggle with verbalizing their stressors and instead might demonstrate irritability, changes in behavior, difficulty sleeping/sleeping too much, neglecting responsibilities, or showing signs of physical illness. To help students with stress levels it's important to help them utilize different management techniques. Stress management can look different for everyone, but

encouraging students to get enough rest, exercise, make time for fun, and communicate about their needs can help set them up for success.

STUDENT SCHEDULING INFORMATION FOR 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR:

This week, our students began the scheduling process for next school year. On Wednesday, they saw an informational video and received handouts with pertinent information regarding academic programming. On Friday, teachers indicated their core course recommendations on each student's Course Request Form and students turned one copy of that in and took the yellow copy home use to enter their course requests online. Students also received a set of online scheduling instructions with their username and password to access the website. Any students who were absent on Wednesday and/or Friday can review the video on Schoology and get their teacher recommendations and instruction sheet next week when they return to school.

Students have until Friday, February 18th to enter their course requests. Please review their course requests with them. If you have any questions or concerns regarding teacher course recommendations, please contact that teacher to discuss. Counselors can help with any academic program questions you may have. The school district course guide can be a great resource for questions about graduation requirements and course descriptions.

Upcoming ACT:

The Ohio Department of Education is funding the administration of the ACT for all Juniors in the state. Anderson High School will be administering the ACT to all Juniors on March 1, 2022.

- Parents and students do not need to register for the exam
- The testing session will begin at 8:00 am and is estimated to end by 12:15 pm.
- Juniors will be expected to report to their testing location no later than 8am.
- Due to the importance of the ACT, and time required for testing, all Juniors will be dismissed for the day after completion of the exam. If students are unable to find transportation they may report to their typical classes for the remainder of the day.
- Lunch will be provided for any Junior at 12:37.


