• LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION:

Local scholarship applications will be available for interested seniors beginning Friday, March 24th. Due to generous donations from school, parent, and community organizations, a substantial list of scholarships will be available for seniors this year. Last year we awarded 45 scholarships for a total amount of \$32,350.00! In order to be eligible, seniors must have a 3.5 weighted grade point average (GPA) or higher and complete an online application (link below). The deadline for applying for these scholarships is midnight on Monday, April 17th when the online application will close. Scholarship winners will be notified by mail.

• Upcoming End of Course Exams and Schedules

Students enrolled in the following classes will be testing first thing each morning for End of Course Exams:

- 04/12 04/13 ELA2
- 04/18 04/19 Algebra 1 and Geometry
- 04/20 US History, American Government, and Biology

These assessments are extremely important and tied to student graduation. Please talk to your child about which classes they are enrolled in and the dates they will be testing.

Due to testing we will run on a two-hour delay for the dates mentioned above. IF YOUR STUDENT IS TESTING, THEY NEED TO BE HERE AT 8AM! Other students who should report at 8am are those attending an AP review session (AP teachers will let students know) as well as students with multiple missing assignments (look for an email or phone call from the school).

Transportation will remain as normal on these dates. If your child does not need to report until 10am, but still needs district bussing, they should take their typical scheduled bus and spend the first two hours of the day in the cafeteria with adult supervision. This time will be used as an extended study hall.

• Fast Facts: May 2nd Combination Levy

Did you know that out of 22 school districts in Hamilton County, FHSD ranks 14th in school residential tax rate. Despite being one of the highest performing schools in the county, FHSD has a below average tax rate. School districts in Hamilton County have an average rate of 43.66 mills, while FHSD's rate is only 38.89 mills.

A 5.4 mill operating levy and 1.5 mill permanent improvement levy will be combined into one issue for the Primary/Special Election on May 2, 2023. As the vote approaches, FHSD is continuing to share factual information about the 6.9 mill combination levy and district finances.
