

### <u>Advanced Placement Testing</u>

AP tests are just a little over a week away! Students will have access to testing locations, seat numbers, and proctors early next week. Please pay close attention to the set <u>AP testing</u> <u>schedule</u>. College Board only allows testing to take place during determined test windows. Therefore, it is important students are where they need to be on time, if not early! Also note, some tests may go past the 2:40 end of day at Anderson High School. No student will be

dismissed until the end of the time frame required by College Board. If your student has any questions about AP testing tell them to reach out to their AP teacher or <u>Mrs. Bamber</u>.

Students have a 25 minute advisory period everyday in their schedule. We encourage students to work with teachers during this time if they need help in any classes. Additionally, teachers have regular office hours before school (7:10-7:55) a few days a week to provide assistance to students.

#### <u>Fast Facts: May 2nd Combination Levy</u>

Ohio law known as House Bill 920 protects homeowners and residents from facing inflationary tax increases as property values increase. This means when property values go up, the effective tax rate in a district decreases because only the amount approved by voters can be collected. **That means that although properties are soon to be reassessed in Hamilton County, any increase in value does not increase the cost of this levy for homeowners.**
