Our Program: Three Pathways Towards Partnership and Learning



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Pathway One: Internships

A student is assigned to the organization for a 6-8 week internship. The student is given tasks to complete, and mentorship to build skills that are relevant to the field. Support is offered from the community partnership specialist to the mentor and/or student, as applicable. Internships primarily take place after school, for a few hours each visit.



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Pathway Two:Shadowing

A student may shadow within the organization for a few hours after school on one or more occasions. The student is expected to observe and become familiar with the tasks associated with the organization. It is likely that the student is also shadowing elsewhere, potentially within other fields. This helps the student establish their interests and preferences. Support is offered from the community partnership specialist to help identify valuable observation opportunities, as applicable.



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Pathway Three:Workshops

The organization is willing to serve on a panel with representatives within their own field, or from a variety of fields to provide discussions or workshops to a group of students.

Preliminary ideas for pathway three could include mock interviews, resumé building workshops, or panel discussions about a particular employability skill.



In addition to the three pathways, make sure you check Schoology and your email for field trips and other opportunities that may take place throughout the year!



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All Levels Of Partnership And Learning Are Valued!

Students can learn through any one pathway or combination of pathways.

Students are expected to demonstrate timeliness and commitment to any community placement-regardless of the pathway that is chosen.



How are these skills used in the workplace?

Throughout the Community Partnership Program, be prepared to provide brief discussion posts on Schoology related to these learning targets.
