Leading the Way in STEM

Anderson and Turpin High Schools have once again received the Governor's Thomas Edison Award for Excellence in STEM Education and Student Research. Awarded by the Ohio Academy of Science, this recognition acknowledges the science teachers' accomplishments and their commitment to encouraging STEM research outside of the classroom during the 2022-2023 academic year. AHS (pictured below) and THS (pictured above) were the only schools in the Cincinnati area selected for this honor.



Standout Niche Rankings

In the 2024 Best Schools rankings from Niche, a company that ranks and reviews K-12 schools across the country, FHSD earned an overall grade of A. The district also received stellar results in Academics, Teachers and Administration with an A+. Of 606 school districts Niche evaluated in Ohio, FHSD was ranked 6th for Best Teachers in the state.

National Merit Scholars



Fifteen Anderson High School and Turpin High School students were recognized in Fall 2023 for achieving either commended or semifinalist status in the National Merit Scholarship Program. Their academic rigor places them among the top high schoolers in the country.

SUPPORTING STUDENTS

Excellence in PBIS

All nine schools in Forest Hills School District were individually recognized for their efforts in Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports. The Ohio Department of Education and the Ohio PBIS Network granted five schools with gold ratings, two with silver and two with bronze ratings in the 2023 Ohio PBIS Showcase.

Additionally, FHSD is one of only 17 districts in the state of Ohio to be recognized at the district level for excellence in PBIS efforts. PBIS is a preventative and systematic approach that emphasizes the high-quality implementation of evidence-based practices, use of data-based decision-making and organization of supports to help all students experience success. PBIS has been shown to improve student achievement, student behavior and school climate.

Perfect Special Education Rating

Forest Hills School District received a perfect score on the 2023 Ohio Special Education Ratings. The Ohio Department of Education reviews a variety of factors to determine a district's implementation of federal requirements, also called compliance measures, as well as results for students with disabilities.

FHSD earned a perfect rating of 4.0 according to the state's review of the relevant data and information. The district is proud of the hard work that went into earning this rating and is committed to continue providing quality services for students in the most need. Appropriate instructional supports accomodations can help ensure students with disabilities are able to achieve at high levels.

Additionally, the theater programs regularly put on top-quality performances that promote creativity and artistic expression to enrich students' educational experiences.

ATHLETICS

FHSD students of all grade levels have the opportunity to participate in athletics. These activities give students the chance to discover and explore their passions and talents in a setting that promotes physical wellbeing. Athletics also teach valuable skills, such as teamwork, responsibility and resilience, that can apply to many other areas of life. Students benefit from leadership opportunities. FHSD offers 36 teams for 12 sports at Nagel Middle School and 30 athletic programs at the high school level.













CLUBS & ORGANIZATIONS

FHSD has an array of clubs and organizations that provide unique opportunities outside of the classroom to every student. Students can discover and dive into their passions and interests with fellow classmates. These opportunities include visual and performing arts, community service, leadership organizations, athletics, technology, cooking and much more.

FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

The Treasurer's Office of Forest Hills School District understands the district's duty to operate efficiently and in a fiscally responsible manner. My staff and I work diligently to ensure we remain strong stewards of public funds, to help protect the investment taxpayers are making in public education to benefit our community. Our efforts to honor that responsibility include FHSD's participation in the Ohio Checkbook and our regular recognition with the Auditor of State Award for effective financial practices, which the district received again in January.

I want to thank our community for its passage of the May 2023 combination levy. These funds, which will support educational priorities and allow for vitally important repairs and improvements to district facilities, are helpful in providing a strong financial foundation for Forest Hills School District. Hamilton County does not start collecting funds until 2024 because the election was held in 2023, however the amount of this levy is matched with the 2023 tax value indicated on the ballot and does not adjust to any changes in property values for existing homes.

Our commitment to fiscal responsibility will continue to be clear in our usage of the new funds. As stated, part of the levy will support the permanent improvement fund. By law, those dollars are required to be used for capital improvement projects, maintenance and repairs of school property and certain equipment items that are designed to last five years or more. The district commissioned a comprehensive, full-facility assessment from an outside agency to better understand the specific needs for all schools and buildings in Forest Hills. This allows us to prioritize and plan for necessary repairs and improvements, ensuring every dollar is spent in the most effective and efficient way possible.

As always, FHSD will continue to find ways to reduce costs and increase operational efficiencies to ensure this investment from the community is stretched as many years as possible. This is an ongoing process that the district practices each and every year, focused on providing the best possible education at a reasonable cost.
