

The district was pleased to welcome aboard a second, full-time School Resource Officer this fall. SRO Ryan Wolf and SRO Jeremy Dwyer (pictured right) serve the students, staff and community diligently and offer expertise and guidance in crafting emergency response plans at all FHSD school buildings. This important part of the district's overall approach to safety is made possible through a partnership with Anderson Township to share the cost of these positions. The SROs are sworn deputies with the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office.



Expanding Opportunities

FHSD's Community Partnership Program continues to build on its momentum to create new learning opportunities for students. The revamped program is finishing its second semester, and dozens of students have benefitted from valuable partnerships with The Christ Hospital Health Network (pictured right) and OrthoCincy Orthopaedics & Sports Medicine. Other career fields where students have participated in internships, job shadowing, mentorships or workshops include legal fields, aviation, construction, engineering, architecture and more.

New this fall, FHSD is partnering with the Anderson Area Chamber of Commerce to offer a comprehensive leadership development program for 10th grade students at Anderson and Turpin High Schools. The Aspire Youth Discovery Initiative is a monthly learning series that is expand students' self-awareness, designed to employability skills and leadership potential. The program's year-long itinerary focuses on topics including communication, problem solving, collaboration, financial literacy, career counseling and more.

FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

Forest Hills School District is deeply committed to providing an exceptional educational experience in a fiscally responsible manner. We understand the investment our community has made in public education and our financial operations are carefully reviewed and examined to ensure that money is being spent in the most efficient manner.

I would like to thank the community for its support of the combination levy on the May ballot. This provides critical funding for both the day-to-day operations and the capital infrastructure needs of the school district. This is crucial to strengthening the overall

financial position of FHSD to make it possible for our educators to continue offering unmatched opportunities in and out of the classroom.

Collections on the levy do not start until 2024, but the district is already working diligently to develop plans to prioritize necessary physical improvement to make the most of every dollar spent. FHSD has commissioned an independent, third-party evaluation of all district school buildings and facilities, which will provide relevant data to guide this process. The permanent improvement portion of the May levy is required by law to be spent on capital improvement projects, maintenance and repairs of school property and certain equipment items that are designed to last five years or more. This will allow the school district to better protect the considerable investment the community has made over the years in our school buildings.

In November, I presented the five-year forecast to the Board of Education. This document looks at the district's General Fund revenues, expenditures and cash balance. With the community's support through this additional funding, the forecast now projects an ending cash balance of more than \$16 million ending cash balance in fiscal year 2028.

While many of us deal with monetary challenges posed by rising costs of fuel, groceries, services and more, FHSD must also navigate a growing number of financial pressures. Please know that as we work to operate more efficiently and look for creative ways to reduce costs, your investment in the schools is making a big difference. Thank you.


