



FISCAL RESPONSIBILITY

Forest Hills School District is deeply committed to demonstrating responsible stewardship of public tax dollars, and one of the district's key focuses of our Strategic Plan is to routinely examine current practices to find ways to increase operational efficiency. One strong example of that commitment is represented by the fact that, despite inflationary increases to a variety of costs in recent years, FHSD continues to operate at a significantly lower overall cost per pupil than the average school district in Hamilton County. This is a testament to the collective efforts of staff and administrators who constantly look for ways to lower costs and operate programs more efficiently.

The district also recognizes the importance of being open and transparent about financial operations and planning so the community can be properly informed about the ongoing investment taxpayers make in our schools. By providing monthly reports at public Board of Education Meetings, which are summarized and shared on the district's website and social media channels, as well as participation in online tools like the Ohio Checkbook, FHSD is proactive in sharing important financial information with our community.

FHSD will continue these efforts to look for ways to reduce costs and operate more efficiently. This is an ongoing process that the district practices each and every year, focused on providing the best possible education at a reasonable cost.




FHSD received the Auditor of State award in March 2025 to recognize the district's "clean" audit report and effective financial practices.
