UPDATES TO THE 22-23 ACADEMIC CALENDAR

Slight adjustments to the 2022-2023 Academic Calendar were introduced in May and approved by the Board of Education during its June meeting. You can view the most up-to-date calendars by clicking here.

- First Day of School/Phase-In Days Based on parent feedback, the District will alternate each school year which half of the alphabet reports to school first. Students with last names M-Z will report to school on August 18 and will be off on August 19. Students with last names A-L will be off August 18 and report to school on August 19. Beginning August 22, all students should report to school. (In 2023-2024, A-L will start first, followed by M-Z.)
- Parent-Teacher Conferences Whereas in the past, Middle and High School evening conferences have been late in the Fall (often after the end of Quarter 1), these conferences have been adjusted to provide parents a formal opportunity to meet with teachers prior to the conclusion of the 1st and 3rd Quarters.
- New Years & Spring Break New Year's 2023 falls on Sunday, meaning Monday is the federally recognized holiday (non-workday). As a result, Tuesday must become our Teacher Work Day (no students) and Wednesday, January 4 will become the first day back for students after Winter Break. Because of the loss of a school day, the Monday after Spring Break (April 10) will return to a regular school day.
- Long Weekends First, we moved the January 27 Teacher Professional Development Day to March 17. Second, we moved our February 10 Teacher Professional Development Day to February 17 to "piggyback" the Presidents' Day Weekend, thereby creating a 4-day weekend for our students and families in February.
