What Is the Experience Program?

In an effort to meet the needs of a diverse student population Forest Hills School District implemented a progressive educational program, the Experience Program, during the summer of 2017. Through innovation, technology and smaller class sizes, students who experience difficulty in a traditional high school setting are empowered to achieve personal success. To do this, the Experience Program students are presented with a variety of options to help them meet their academic goals while continuing to be linked to services and experiences that are essential to self-discovery success, such as counseling, extracurriculars, and career exploration.

What Is a Class Like in the Experience Program?

The Experience Program, a progressive, competency-based approach to learning, allows flexibility for students to complete course work while they continue to develop strong relationships with other Turpin students and staff members. Students will attend the Experience Program either in the morning or afternoon in a blended learning environment that includes computers, small groups, and adult guidance. Turpin's Experience Program is housed at Turpin High School, 2650 Bartels Road. By completing class work in a technology-infused setting, students are able to utilize online resources to meet their academic goals. In addition, Turpin's Experience Program Instructional Aide works with specific students to foster goal-setting, encourage attendance, track progress, monitor behavior and well-being, and facilitate communication to parents.

Who Can Attend the Experience Program?

To begin the process to participate in the Experience Program, a student, parent, or staff member should contact the student's high school counselor to initiate the referral process. Once a referral is made, a referral team consisting of a counselor, administrator, staff member, student, and a member of the student's family will analyze the student's needs (social, academic, medical, attendance, etc.), past academic data, and the student's ability to work independently from a classroom environment. If it is determined that the Experience Program is an appropriate option for a student, the student will then meet with staff to choose an appropriate pathway, set goals, and review program expectations, policies, and procedures.
