Half-Day Kindergarten

There is an important change that will impact our Half-Day Kindergarten (HDK) program next school year. Although HDK has traditionally been offered at all elementary schools, due to declining HDK enrollment, effective next school year we will consolidate these low-enrollment classes and will only offer HDK at Summit, Maddux, and Wilson. Accordingly, HDK students whose home school is Ayer will attend HDK at Summit; students whose home school is Sherwood will attend HDK at Maddux; and students whose home school is Mercer will attend HDK at Wilson. Lastly, based on enrollment, at this time we will only offer HDK during the morning session.
