## Back to School Bash (Open House)

The Back to School Bash is scheduled for Tuesday, August 19 from 4:30 to 6:30pm. We welcome students and their families to

visit the classrooms and drop off any school supplies (to make the first day backpack much lighter). The event is an open house format, but things are typically less crowded towards the end.

Mrs. Augenstein will be available in the main office to receive any school fees if you would like to avoid any online credit card fees.

### **New Family Orientation**

If your family is new to Wilson (this doesn't include our Kindergarten families), we will host a brief new family orientation on August 19 from 6:00pm to 6:30 pm in the Wilson iLab. Both parents and students are encouraged to attend. During this orientation our new students will have a short activity and an opportunity to tour the building with our Sixth Grade Ambassadors. While the students are touring the building the new parents will spend time learning more about Wilson and operational logistics.

## Bus Route Information and A Call For Bus Helpers

Wilson will most likely have some new bus routes and bus numbers. Information regarding students' pickup and drop off times will be released by Monday. New this year, families will receive an email notification from Stopfinder, an all-in-one bus routing system. Route information will be available for families within the Stopfinder App. It's recommended to check the route information regularly the first couple weeks of school, as minor adjustments may be made to bring greater efficiency to daily

routes. If you have any transportation-related questions, it's best to contact the Transportation Department directly at (513) 231-3335.

As a reminder, the buses typically run a little slower than normal the first few days of school as the kids and drivers get used to the routes.

For the first several days of school we will have bus volunteers (click here if you're interested in helping: <u>BUS HELPERS</u>) supporting Kindergarten and First grade students off the bus in the mornings, and to the bus in the afternoons. We will always get our littlest Wildcats off the bus and onto the bus first.

### Parent Drop off and Pickup Procedures

We will use the same process as we have the past few years. New to Wilson families will receive a car tag (veteran Wilson families should continue to use the same tag). For a visual of the process, click here: DROP OFF & PICK UP TRAFFIC FLOW.

- Morning Drop Off
  - Enter the parking lot closest to Wolgangel and keep to the right.
  - You may begin to form two rows only after passing the endmost point of the parking lot (to keep a lane open for cars to exit).
  - Vehicles will be held in the queue in the driveway perpendicular to the school.
  - Vehicles will move into the unloading zone as directed by staff. Once in the unloading zone, please put your vehicle in "Park".

- Students may only exit their vehicle when given the 'thumbs up' from staff.
- Once all students have exited their vehicles cars may only leave the unloading zone once directed by staff.
- Please refrain from parking in the lot and walking your student to the door.

### Afternoon Pick Up

- Vehicles should enter the driveway the same way as during drop off.
- Kindergarten students will be walked to their cars by a staff member (be sure to have your parking tag visible).
- First through Sixth grade students will be assisted by staff in finding their vehicle. We will load as many vehicles as we can, however, if your car is beyond the sidewalk we will have the students wait by the benches.

#### **Lunch with Students**

We are excited that our families are able to have lunch with our Wildcats, and we love having our families in the building. In saying that, it is important that our students have time to adjust to the routines and procedures at school while building relationships with their teachers and peers.
