Reports Coming Home Today and Conference Sign Up Link

Today we are sending home the most recent iReady diagnostic results. These results are similar to a temperature check at a doctor's office. Sometimes the results are accurate to what we see everyday, sometimes there are factors that make the results slightly different than we expected. As our students take the assessment, we take into consideration these factors and combine them with the daily observations and assessments that we give. As an entire building, our students scored in the high-growth/high-performance categories in both reading and math. We have many celebrations, both individually and as a whole. We also found some areas that we want to continue to work to improve. The Teaching and Learning Team also sent information out earlier this week with helpful tips to consider when reviewing the reports. See communication here- <u>LINK</u>

3rd Grade Parents - Fall OST Results -

In October 2023, your child was administered Ohio's Grade 3 English Language Arts state assessment. Proficiency on this assessment is expected by the end of 3rd grade. Another state ELA test will be given in the spring of 2024.

This rigorous online assessment is used to measure your child's performance in both reading and writing skills. It is one measure used to determine if your child meets the state requirements for the Third Grade Reading Guarantee.

A score of 700 or better is considered a passing score for this state test. However, a student only needs to obtain an overall score of 690 or a Reading subscore of 48 to meet the Third Grade Reading Guarantee requirements. Each student in third grade will have two more opportunities to meet the Third Grade Reading Guarantee this year in order to be promoted to the 4th grade. Your child will have another opportunity to take the state test in the spring, as well as another chance to score a 515 or higher on the spring i-Ready reading assessment. We will also continue to work together to provide strong reading instruction and intervention to ensure growth for all of our students.
