Counselor's Corner

Jean Bode and Jessie Martin, for the upcoming Parent Academy session on Feb. 19th, focused on How to Keep Cool When Things Heat Up by understanding habits that can be trashed or treasured. We'll explore how certain habits (like arguing, lying, or power struggles) can quickly heat things up at home—and how responding differently can help everyone stay calm and connected.

Parents will learn how to:

- Recognize how bad habits add fuel to the fire
 - Catch habits early and celebrate the right ones
 - How to avoid power struggles
 - Use choices and shared control to cool tense moments
 - Match the size of the reaction to the size of the problem
 - Help children take responsibility when they make mistakes.
- Strengthen treasure habits by noticing what your child and family do well most of the time.
