District Information

Second Grade CogAT Testing

Ohio's revised standards for gifted education require all districts to provide cognitive testing once during the K-2 grade band and once during the 3-6 grade band. FHSD currently tests students in 2nd and 4th grades using CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test). The CogAT Test measures the level and pattern of cognitive development of a student compared to age mates and grade mates. These general reasoning abilities, which start developing at birth and continue through early adulthood, are influenced by experiences gained both in and out of school.

Second graders throughout the district will take the assessment on February 2-5, 2026.

The test is divided into 3 subtests, verbal, non-verbal, and quantitative, which take approximately 45 minutes each. Students

will do these subtests over the course of three settings in the classroom. This testing is used to identify students who are cognitively gifted. We use this information as a measure for providing gifted services and support for student learning.

Since this assessment is about how students think, there is nothing you need to do to prepare your child. It is all about how students process information, recognize patterns, and make connections with pictures, numbers, and symbols. The best way to help your child is to make sure they have a good night's sleep and breakfast.
