## Wilson Clash of the Quarters for Shop and Share

Wilson's version of coin wars is called Clash of the Quarters will begin Monday and run through Tuesday, Nov. 21 st. Here's how it works: students can bring in coins as they enter school in the morning and drop the coins in the grade appropriate jar. Only quarters are positive and should be placed in their grade's jar (1 quarter $=25$ points). All other coins and bills are negative points for the grade level they chose to put the money in (1 penny $=-1$ or $\$ 1=-100$ points). Students are encouraged to raise the coins to bring in and can then fill out a service slip explaining what they did to earn the donation. The grade level with the most service slips and the most points each day will be recognized.

## New Crosswalk and Sidewalk

Over the last couple of months we've watched as Anderson Township has constructed a new sidewalk near Wilson on Little Dry Run and Lawyer Road. We're excited that this will continue to help connect nearby neighborhoods to Wilson!

Please note a big change and help spread the word of another big CHANGE with this project. Pedestrians traveling towards Wilson from Bretton, Turnberry, Anderson Manor, Titian, etc., will be able to use a NEW crosswalk on the west side of the intersection.

We ask that drivers help keep an eye out for pedestrians using this new crossing. It will greatly improve safety, as students coming from those areas only will now need to only cross one roadway. This new crosswalk also should help to improve traffic flow at the Little Dry Run \& Wolfangel 3-way stop.

Beginning Monday, November 13, Anderson Township will begin landslide construction along Clough Pike. ## Scripps National Spelling Bee

The Scripps National Spelling Bee is the nation's longest-running educational promotion, conducted on a not-for-profit basis by The E.W. Scripps Company and 291 sponsors in the United States, Europe, Canada, New Zealand, Guam, Jamaica, The Bahamas, Ghana, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and American Samoa. This year, Wilson students in grades 5 and 6 will have the opportunity to participate in the 2024 Scripps Spelling Bee. Each grade level will conduct a bee within their respective grade to determine the finalists who will compete for the opportunity to advance to the regional round.

The winner of the competition will have the opportunity to participate in the 2024 WCPO 9 Regional Spelling Bee (OH ,KY \& IN). This will be held at the Cincinnati Public Schools Education Center on March 9,2024. No more than 20 school spelling bee champions across the region will qualify to participate in the WCPO 9 Regional Spelling Bee. An online test is required to select the finalists. Winners of regional bees will have the opportunity to compete in the National Bee, traditionally held the week after Memorial Day in Washington, D.C.

We are grateful to the Forest Hills Foundation for Education for supporting all six elementary buildings in bringing the Bee back! Learning new words, setting a goal, planning and preparing are the real benefits of participation in a bee. We are looking forward to the competition!
