3rd Grade Ohio State Testing Information- Oct. 24 and Oct. 25

Each fall, students in the 3rd grade are required to take the state assessment for English Language Arts. This test will be taken electronically through the Ohio State Test Portal.

In order for students to become familiar with this testing procedure, the state has provided practice resources for parents and students. Tutorials are available to teach navigation skills on the testing site as well as how to use the embedded testing tools. Teachers will be introducing these tutorials with students in the classroom. Parents may also want to review them with their child by accessing the following website:

- Wednesday, October 25th Part 2 = 90 minutes
